12:30–3:30	<p>National Safety and Quality Health Service standards workshops</p> <p>The National Safety and Quality Health Service (NSQHS) standards were developed by the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care (the Commission) in collaboration with the Australian Government, states and territories, the private sector, clinical experts, patients and carers.</p> <p>The primary aims of the NSQHS standards are to protect the public from harm and to improve the quality of health service provision.</p> <p>They provide a quality assurance mechanism that tests whether relevant systems are in place to ensure that expected standards of safety and quality are met.</p> <p>The first edition was released in 2012 and there were ten standards. The second edition, released in November 2017, has eight standards. Each of the presenters at these workshops will focus on one or two standards and share their knowledge and experience of the accreditation process and the introduction of the second edition of the national standards commencing in 2019.</p>
